JUDGMENT

The Defendant has been arraigned on a 1 Count Amended Information dated 04/07/19 on allegation of Possession of Fraudulent Documents contrary to **Section 320** of the **Criminal Law of Lagos State, 2015** to which he pleaded Guilty upon his entering into a Plea Bargain Agreement dated same 04/07/19, jointly executed by him, his Counsel, the Prosecuting Counsel and the Investigating Officer.

The Defendant's extra judicial statements, his confessional Admission Form and the documents printed out from his email are **Exhibits P1-P5**.

The Prosecution's Review of Facts of same date has it that the Defendant with his syndicate were arrested at Forthright Estate, Magboro, Ogun State on an Intelligence Report on the case of Possession of Documents, Internet Fraud and Obtaining money under False Pretence. The Defendant upon his arrest admitted that he is into online dating and has been able to get a victim and defrauded him of about \$800 Canadian Dollars. He also admitted that he is into dating scam where he presents himself as a white woman called Carol Davies.


The Defendant having therefore pleaded Guilty is hereby convicted as charged and sentenced to one year imprisonment commencing from today.

In view of the timely Plea of Guilty and the filing of a Plea Bargain Agreement, a Proof of his remorse, the Defendant is hereby granted an option of a fine of ₦250,000 in lieu of his prison term.



The Defendant shall also enter into a Bond with the Commission to be of good behaviour and never to be found wanting again anywhere in this country or beyond.

This is the judgment of the court.
