JUDGMENT


The Defendant herein has been arraigned on an Amended Information dated 10/07/19 on 2 Counts of Possession of Fraudulent Document Contrary to **Section 318** of the **Criminal Law of Lagos State, 2011**. He is alleged to have on or about the 13th day of June, 2019 with intent to defraud had in his possession a document titled "Persona Info" where he represented himself as Nancy Crawhorn (a female) which representation he knew or ought to have known to be false. The Defendant pleaded guilty to the 2 Counts Amended Information and the Prosecution tendered copies of his extra-judicial Statement, the Admission of Confessional Statement Form and the Prints out from his e-mail which are **Exhibits P1 – P3 respectively**. This is sequel to the Plea Bargain Agreement dated 10/07/19 jointly executed by the Parties and their respective Counsel with the Investigating Officer.

The Defendant having therefore pleaded guilty, is hereby convicted as charged on the 2 Counts. The Defendant is accordingly sentenced to one year imprisonment. He shall upon his release from custody give an undertaken to the EFCC to be of good behaviour and never be involved in any form of crime again.

The Defendant shall also forfeit to the Federal Government of Nigeria the I-Phone and Techno Pop Phone recovered from him in the course of the Investigation.

However, because of the timely Plea Bargain opted for and agreed with the Prosecution, the Defendant is hereby granted an option of a fine of N250,000 in lieu of his prison term failing which the prison term shall abide from today.

This is the Judgment of the Court.
