The convict is sentenced to 5 years in the custody of the Nigeria Correctional service or option of 1 million fine to be paid into the account in which fines levied by this court are paid. Sentence shall commence from today. It is further ordered that the contents of paragraph 3 to 6 of the plea bargain agreement be done or effected. The order of forfeiture shall not force close the convict from forfeiting any other property which the EFCC may find as proceeds of the crime for which he has been convicted. Convict shall make an undertaking to be of good behavior
