JUDGMENT

The charge against the Defendant is dated and filed 29th day of October, 2021 which reads as follows:

1. That you, **BADMUS RIDWAN MOYOSORE (CATHERINE ANNIE)**, sometimes in December, 2020 at Ilorin, within the jurisdiction of this Honourable Court, Cheat by personation by pretending to be one **CATHERINE ANNIE**, a white female with email account willicath7070@gmail.com and in that guise induced one Eugene Noll to send to you \$200 (Two Hundred USD) Via Gift Card and thereby committed an Offence Contrary to Section 321 of the Penal Code Law and punishable under Section 324 of the same Penal Code Law.

The defendant pleaded guilty to the charge.


The prosecution thereafter reviewed the facts of the case and tendered the following items in evidence:

1. One Phone identified as Samsung X6 – Exhibit 1.
2. One Black HP Laptop – Exhibit 2.

3. Two EFCC Telephone / Computer attestation forms in the name of **Badmus Ridwan Moyosore** – Exhibit 3A and 3B.
4. A bunch of computer generated documents together with a Certificate of Identification – Exhibit 4A and 4B.
5. Three Statements of **Badmus Ridwan Moyosore** dated 19/9/21, 22/9/21 and 27/9/21 – Exhibit 5A, 5B and 5C respectively
6. A sum of \$200 in \$100 denomination – Exhibit 6.

Based on the plea of guilt by the defendant, the reviewed facts by the prosecution which the defendant has confirmed relates to his plea and the Exhibits tendered, the court is satisfied about the guilt of the defendant to the charge against him.

Accordingly, the provision of Section 280 of the Kwara State Administration of Criminal Justice Law is hereby invoked and the defendant is found guilty of the two counts of charges against him.

SENTENCE: The convict is sentenced to six months imprisonment but with the option of the payment of fine of N100, 000 (One Hundred Thousand Naira).
